Avalon inspires healing and empowerment for those affected by sexual violence through free and immediate comprehensive services; promotes public awareness; and advances social change.

About Avalon

Avalon is a non-profit, 501(c)3, comprehensive organization that provides compassionate and trauma-informed care to survivors of sexual assault.

Avalon provides a safe, quiet, confidential environment with specially trained Sexual Assault Forensic Examiners in order to provide medical examinations and forensic evidence collection for rape victims.

We are staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our services are free of charge. Services are available to ALL ages and gender identities. Medical-forensic exams are provided up to 120 hours post assault. Counseling and advocacy services are available to anyone who identifies as a survivor of sexual assault, sexual abuse or incest ~ no matter when it occurred. Our services are available to anyone, despite where they live or where they were assaulted.

Healing Center Open House

Avalon Healing Center moved into our new 24,000 square feet building at 601 Bagley Street in March 2023, coinciding with our growth and quadrupling our space for client services. To celebrate this momentous occasion, we opened the building to community partners, major donors, prospective donors, survivors and the public at large and hosted an Open House event on the evening of Thursday, June 29th, 2023.

This was the first time we have ever held an event this large with the purpose of reaching out to the community to raise awareness about who we are, what we do, where and how we do it, while also having the opportunity for our entire team to connect directly with survivors, community partners, funders and donors ~ ALL IN ONE PLACE! 

Holistic Healing Services







At Avalon Healing Center, our mission is to promote comprehensive well-being through holistic healing practices by providing accessible, effective, and compassionate care to individuals and communities in need. We believe in the interconnectedness of physical, emotional, and spiritual health and aim to support individuals on their journey to balance and harmony.

In 2023, Avalon Healing Center moved into the building – four times the space of our previous occupancy – which allowed for expanded services. In addition to the new space, Avalon received funding to support new and expanded culturally-specific holistic programs and services, which all demonstrate benefits for trauma survivors, mitigating the impacts of risk factors and cultural determinants of health that interfere with recovery. The funding supported deploying alternative therapeutic specialists and facilitators to promote survivors' healing and empowerment. These services are offered in addition to Avalon's current suite of funded programs that are more traditional in nature, such as individual and group counseling, case management, and person-centered advocacy.

Client - Centered Events







At the heart of Avalon's mission is the commitment to uplifting and empowering our clients. In 2023, we deepened our connections by organizing two meaningful client-centered events: the Survivor Walk in April and the Survivor Brunch in December. These events were more than gatherings; they were powerful expressions of resilience and solidarity, providing a space for survivors to share their journeys, celebrate their strength, and build a support network. By centering our clients in these moments, we reaffirm our belief that healing is a community effort, and we continue to ensure that their voices guide our path forward.

The annual survivor walk was held in April in honor of Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), and included breakfast, various artistic performances, and lunch for over 60 clients and volunteers. We value our close partnership with our neighbors at DTE Energy, who volunteered their time and helped promote and facilitate the walk.

In December, we held our holiday brunch for clients, providing a continental breakfast and gifts to over 40 clients and their families, thanks to the generous support of the Kind Hearted group, who helped make this event possible.




